FROM THE CEO

The town and tourist park are still busy with tourists and travellers stopping to enjoy the attractions of Cue. I hope you enjoy your stay and visit again in the future.

Thank you to everyone that provided input into our community survey, your feedback will assist Council in guiding the future direction for the Shire. The information will be collated and integrated into the review of the Community Strategic Plan.

At the August Council meeting, Council adopted the 2021-2022 budget, including the rate in the dollar for all categories of rateable properties within the Shire. Ratepayers should expect to receive their rates notices very soon. Ratepayers that pay their rates in full before 5 October 2021 will go into the automatic draw to win one of three cash prizes.

The Murdoch University Vet Program will be returning to Cue in October. Dates are still to be finalised but it is anticipated it will be for one day between Sunday 17 October and Friday 22 October. Students from the university will be providing free pet checks and sterilisation under the guidance of a senior vet. Other services available include microchipping and vaccination at the owner's expense. Please note that this service is provided by the Shire of Cue and can only be provided to dogs and cats registered with the Shire. Bookings are essential and can be made through the Shire office.

The Pox-Eclipse wastelander event unfortunately had to be postponed to a future date but with the assistance of the Shire of Cue a mini event was held last weekend. Over a hundred people enjoyed a line-up of four bands at the Murchison Club Hotel on Friday night and the entourage had a turn out on Saturday at the Victoria Street Park where they enjoyed a bbq lunch with the kids from the youth centre, locals and travellers. There were lots of photo opportunities with a line-up of themed people, vehicles and bikes.



Mosquitos are starting to present themselves again and the Shire of Cue will undertake fogging operations when weather conditions allow. Residents are asked to check their properties and remove any potential mosquito breeding areas, by emptying containers holding water, ensuring gutters are not holding water and checking yards for areas that hold water.

Patching works have been completed on the Beringarra Cue Road and stabilising works are about to be commenced near the Glenn Station. Flood damage works are still being undertaken by contractors on a number of roads between Coodardy and Austin Downs. For your own safety and the safety of the workers, please obey all traffic control signs when passing through roadworks.

Local Government elections are due to be held on 16 October this year, with three of the seven Cue Councillor positions becoming vacant. Nominations will open on 02 September and remain open for one week, closing on 9 September. Anyone intending to nominate for election must first complete a free online induction course, provided by the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries (DLGSC) at www.dlgsc.wa.gov.au/local-government. The course gives community members a basic understanding of what is required from a council member.

The next ordinary Council meeting will be held at 6:30pm on Tuesday 28 September 2021.

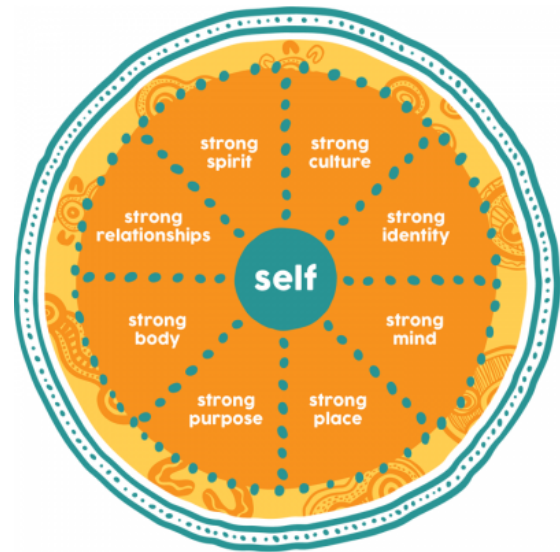

The vaccine was approved too quickly to be safe.



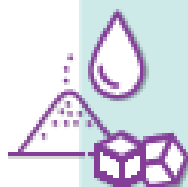

COVID-19 vaccines can't change your DNA

The vaccines deliver instructions to your cells to build protection (immunity) against the coronavirus. This does not happen in the part of your cells where your DNA is.



Receiving a COVID-19 vaccine does not make you magnetic – anywhere on your body

COVID-19 vaccines do not contain any magnetic ingredients that could do this. You would need a lot of metal to attract a magnet. For example, people take multi vitamins which often contain iron. This doesn't make them magnetic because they are so diluted and spread through your body.
